



The Orange County- CCW Checklist

Are you looking to get your CCW in Orange County? Take a look at our CCW Checklist to make sure you have everything you need to apply for your CCW! Make sure to always be ready for news from the Sheriff's Department regarding your application status!

- Step 1: Make an appointment with the OC County Sheriff's Department for your initial interview. You can follow the link here: <http://ocsd.org/about/info/services/ccw>
- Step 2: Fill out the California DOJ CCW Application Form. You can download it here: <http://ocsd.org/civicax/filebank/blobdload.aspx?BlobID=31601>
- Step 3: Make sure you have all your supporting documentation including your Birth Certificate, Driver's License, and Proof of Residency. A list of supporting documentation can be found here: <http://ocsd.org/civicax/filebank/blobdload.aspx?BlobID=31602>
- Step 4: Go to your initial interview and bring all of your documentation, completed application form, and payment information with you. If you pass your initial interview, OCSD will send you a Conditional Approval Letter that will detail the next steps of your application process.
- Step 5: Read through your Conditional Approval Letter completely. From here you will need to schedule your 16-Hour CCW Training and a Live Scan background check.
- Step 6\*: Schedule your 16-Hour CCW Training. You can sign up for your CA CCW Training Course with us here: <https://ftatv.com/ccw-california-concealed-carry-weapon-course>
- Step 7\*: Schedule a Live Scan appointment for fingerprinting and a background check. You can get your Live Scan done through the Sheriff's Department or you can use a separate facility. For more information on Live Scan, visit: <http://oag.ca.gov/fingerprints>
- Step 8: The Sheriff's Department will contact you to schedule your final appointment. You will need your 16-hour training certificate and payment information with you when you go to your final appointment.

\* Steps 6 and 7 can be done at anytime, however, it is recommended that this be completed before your final appointment with the Sheriff's Department.
